At the end of this course, participants will:

- Be aware of ethical and legal issues associated with the interviewing processes involved in oral history and social science research
- Gain an overview of oral history collection in Ireland
- Understand what is involved in designing a project e.g. background research, identifying sources
- Be able to draw up a checklist of what they will need to commence their project, including the design of appropriate consent forms
- Use different types of questioning in an interview
- Become familiar with digital recording equipment and saving and preservation of recordings
- Comprehend how to summarise and/or transcribe an interview and prepare the transcription for publication
- Understand how to edit a digital recording and prepare it for use in film/radio/website broadcast
- Recognise the range of resources available in trade union and working class communities.
